Substantive Knowledge (key facts)

- The coast is where the land meets the sea. Over time, coastlines change as a result of coastal erosion.
- Waves are created by the movement of air across the sea. The sea's waves lead to erosion of the land (the wearing away and breaking up of rock along the coast). This results in bays and headlands forming. Further erosion leads to cracks, caves, arches, stacks and stumps.
- Coastal areas are popular for tourism (people visiting for holidays) and residential areas (where people live), but land use is being threatened by coastal erosion.
