

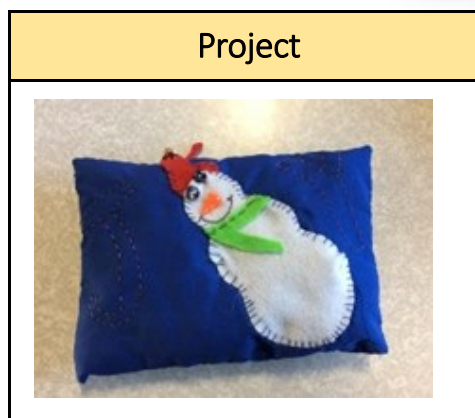

Concept



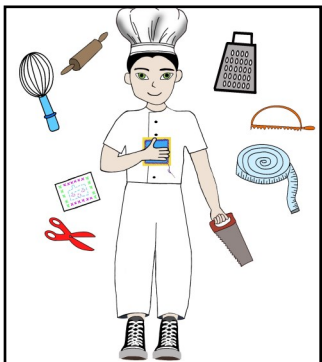
Technical knowledge
• 'joining technique' means connecting two pieces of material together. • Understand that a template (or fabric pattern) is used to cut out the same shape multiple times • Understand that different techniques for joining materials can be used for different purposes



Prior experiences or knowledge learnt
• Cut fabric neatly with scissors • Use joining methods to decorate a hand puppet • Know that there are various temporary methods of joining fabric by using staples, glue or pins.

Skills I am practising
• Appraise and analyse a selection of existing products (embroidered cushions) • Understand how a cross stitch design is created. • Practise skills identified to develop a design of my own. • Generate and develop ideas using exploding diagrams to design an end product. • Think ahead about the order of my work, select tools needed for a given task and give reasons for my choices. • Evaluate a finished product against a design brief.

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Key vocabulary

Tier 2

Attractive—Something that is attractive will evoke a feeling of the desire to obtain something. If a product is attractive, people will want to purchase it.

High-quality—Something that is considered high-quality will fill the design brief and will be purposeful. The product won't damage easily and will look "well made" and neat.

Textiles—Textiles are the use of fabrics as materials to produce a product.

Design—a design is the consideration of materials and methods in order to create a product, also considering the design brief.

Tier 3

Cross-stitch—a method of crossing thread to create a pattern/design.

Running stitch—a method of sewing to join pieces of fabric.
